

In 2007, renovation efforts began at the Hermann Park Japanese Garden under the guidance of Japanese garden architects Terunobu Nakai, Aya Hashimoto and Hiroshi Iwasaki. Houston's Japanese sister city, Chiba City, provided generous assistance in cooperation with the local community effort led by Kunio Minami and Junjiro Naoki. This year Mr. Minami received the Japanese Foreign Minister's Award for his dedication to the revitalization and maintenance of the Japanese Garden. The renovation is ongoing and resulted in the founding of the Japanese Garden Advisory Committee of the Hermann Park Conservancy, the board of which includes leaders from: Japan Business Association of Houston, Japanese Association of Greater Houston, Japan-America Society of Houston, Japanese American Citizens League Houston Chapter and the Consulate-General of Japan in Houston.
